Good afternoon.

The fatality in Big Canoe, which occurred on January 12, 2022, was not reported to OSHA until January 18, 2022, by local authorities. Upon that notification, OSHA immediately initiated an investigation into this tragic event. The investigation is ongoing, therefore we are unable to provide additional details at this time.

Under the OSH Act, all employers are required to notify OSHA when an employee is killed on the job or suffers a work-related hospitalization, amputation, or loss of an eye. A fatality must be reported within 8 hours. An in-patient hospitalization, amputation, or eye loss which must be reported within 24 hours.
